

Princely Jets launches air ambulance service

RECORDER REPORT KARACHI (June 26, 2013) : Pakistan's largest private jet service provider, Princely Jets has launched first-ever private air ambulance service in the country. The most advance helicopters are being used for air ambulance service with highly trained paramedics on board. The helicopters are equipped with technology advanced life support equipments while the medical staff on board is trained to provide emergency treatment of burns, cardiac, respiratory problems, trauma and other emergencies. Princely Jets air ambulance service has been started from its initial base at Quaid-e-Azam international airport Karachi and would soon be expanded to other parts of Pakistan. The air ambulance is being operated with twin engine helicopters that can cover a radius of 254 nautical miles and would be available seven days a week. Skilled medical staff extends care and consideration while transporting patients to a nearby hospital or airport for outbound flights. Princely Jets started its operations in 2005 and it has already grown to a fleet of eight aircrafts. To support this expansion, Princely Jets has set up an operating base at Karachi international airport (terminal one) and is currently constructing a hangar and state-of-the-art maintenance workshop at Karachi airport.
